Beth began employment with the District on August 4, 1975 and has spent her entire career in the Regulation arena. Her first position was Clerk Typist making \$2.91 an hour! She was hired to type permit staff reports for the engineers in the Hydrology Division of Resource Planning in what was then the Central and Southern Florida Flood Control District. Her next position as Administrative Secretary was supporting the newly-established Resource Control Department. She continued to learn and grow as the regulatory function grew in size and complexity. She became a Data Management Technician, entering permit application data into the computer, and was promoted into progressively more responsible functions in the administrative area of permitting. She became a supervisor in 1987.

Today she is responsible for administration and supervision of the regulatory permit application intake process, dealing with a large volume and variety of permits. Over the years the process itself has been legislated to be increasingly complex. It requires a high skill level in order to insure compliance with state statutes and District rules as well as maintain efficient processing to comply with established deadlines. Beth also oversees the permit transfer function, process implementation of statutes and permitting rules, development of permitting administrative procedures, and coordination with the Service Centers for consistency and adherence to the permitting administrative process.
