Gaye began her career at the District in June 1980. Her first position at the District was Engineering Technician in the Water Resources Division of the Planning Department. Using the programming language FORTRAN, she analyzed and modeled rainfall, stage and flow data. In 1983, Gaye transferred to IT as Business Applications Programmer. Gaye was one programmer in a two member IT team that implemented the first financial software package at the District - Management System America (MSA). In 1989, IT decentralized its financial applications and Gaye accepted a position in the newly organized division of Systems Integration in the Finance Department where she continued to support the financial staff and their applications. Because of her expertise, Gaye was asked to participate in a 2 ½ year project to implement the financial systems LGFS and ROSS.

In 1995, wanting to expand her range of knowledge at the District, Gaye was selected for a Staff Systems Programmer Analyst position in the Regulation Department. Post Permit Compliance became her forte with the development of the Enforcement, Construction, Certification and Conversion and Above Ground Impoundment tracking systems. In 2000, she was promoted to Senior Systems Programmer Analyst.

In 2004, as part of the reengineering of the IT Department, Gaye was given additional responsibilities and promoted to the position of Senior Systems Analyst being assigned to continue supporting the Regulation Department. Gaye acted as lead for the IT support team for Regulation and was promoted to Lead Systems Analyst in 2005.
