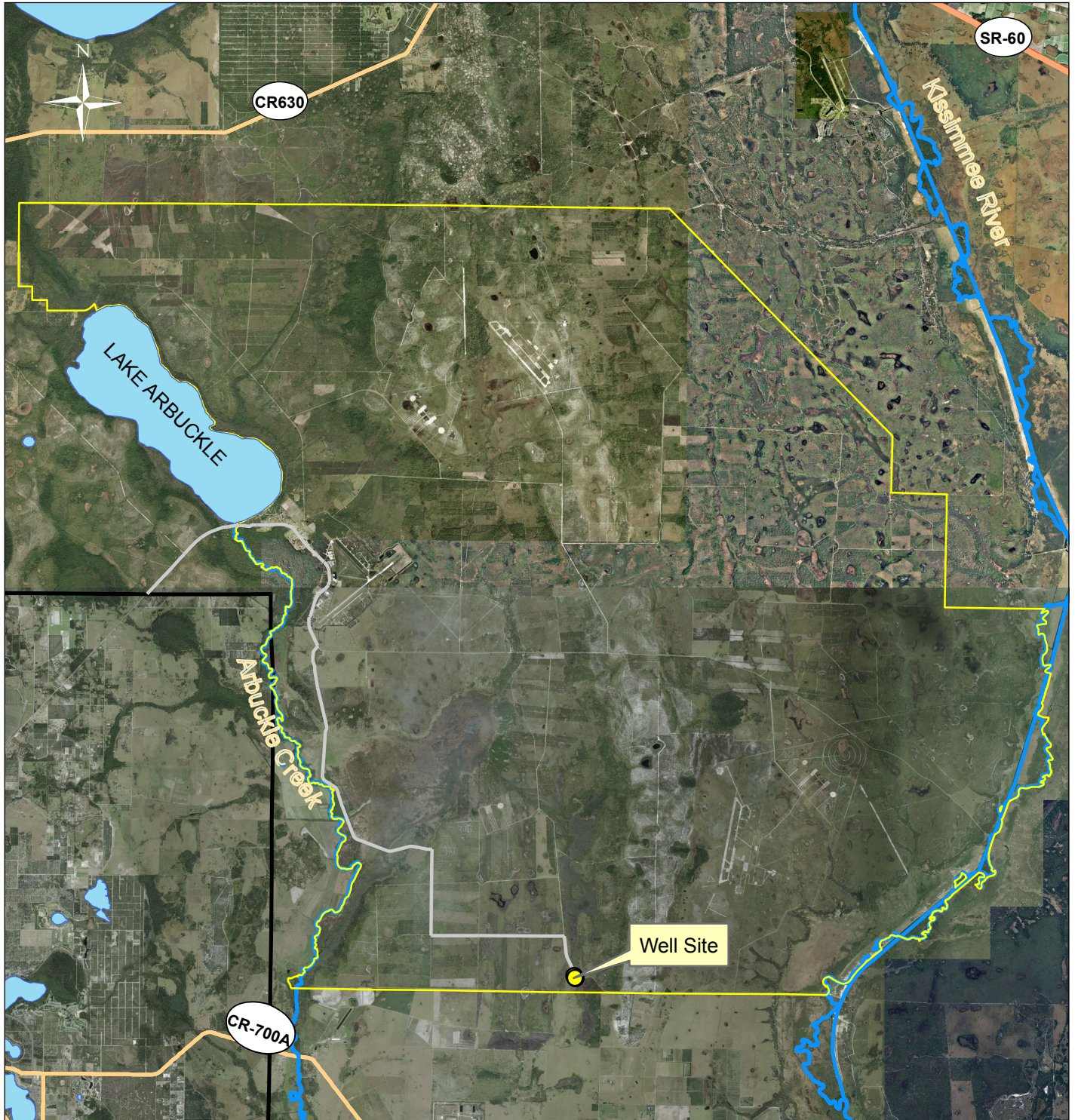

VIOLATIONS

1. A written report will be filed on all individuals apprehended/detained by law enforcement or Outdoor Recreation Program personnel for violation of any federal, state, or installation law or regulation. A report on all violations will be made to the Commander, 56 SS, who will decide whether to formally bar the individual from the installation. The individual will be informed of this decision by mail. Violation of some regulations may result in individuals being immediately escorted from the installation. Vehicle permits will be removed from any involved vehicles, wallet permits confiscated, and the individuals directed not to re-enter the installation until further notice.

2. Every Permit Holder is responsible for the actions of any individual he/she is escorting, sponsoring, or accompanying onto the installation and is liable to be barred from the installation for a period of time to be determined by the commander, 56 SS, for violations committed by such individuals.

HIKING TRAILS

LAKE ARBUCKLE NATURE TRAIL

Is located approximately 1.2 miles north of the Natural Resources Office on Frostproof Road. This trail is a board walk looping approximately 1/2 mile through a cypress bottom to the edge of Lake Arbuckle. At the lake shore is a 30-foot observation tower. Permit required.

LAKE ARBUCKLE NATURAL RECREATION TRAIL

Is a 16-mile Natural Recreation Trail originating at Willingham Campground with a primitive campsite (pitcher pump available) at the 10-mile point. The trail winds through a variety of habitats including cypress bottom, pine plantations, and sand pine/oak scrub. This trail is open 7 days per week. No charge permit required.

SANDY POINT WILDLIFE REFUGE TRAIL

The trailhead is located at the entrance of the Austin Hammock Group Camp ground, north of the Sandy Point Wild life Refuge. The trail winds through a sampling of the major habitat types found on the installation. This is a 6 1/2 mile interpretive trail and a guide pamphlet is available. The trail has several loops enabling the hiker to hike as little or as much as he/she chooses. Permit required.

THE FLORIDA NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL

A 12-mile portion of the Kissimmee River Section of the Florida National Scenic Trail crosses the installation and is open for public access. Fort Kissimmee Campground is the best access point to the trail, although others are available. The trail winds through oak hammocks, freshwater marshes, and pine forests. This section of the Florida Trail continues north and south of the property. The trail is open 7 days a week to "through-hikers" only. Hikers accessing the trail through the installation must obtain a free permit from the Natural Resources Office. "Through-Hikers" are not required to obtain a permit.



WHAT TO DO IF YOUR VEHICLE BREAKS DOWN

1. LEAVE A NOTE ON THE DASHBOARD OF THE VEHICLE AS TO YOUR DIRECTION AND PROBABLE DESTINATION.

2. STAY ON THE ROADS. DO NOT ATTEMPT SHORTCUTS BY TRAVELING CROSS-COUNTRY. THESE PROCEDURES WILL ASSIST OUR PERSONNEL IN LOCATING AND HELPING YOU AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

RULES OF ACCESS

An outdoor Recreation Permit or Hunt Permit must be purchased prior to entering the Public Recreation Area. Access to the area varies with mission activities, the day of the week, the season, and the type of outdoor recreation activity. The following schedule lists general dates, times, and permit requirements for Public Recreation Area Access:

- 12:00 noon Thursday to 8:00 pm Monday
 - From mid-January to mid-October (exact dates to be set by Natural Resources Office)
 - Outdoor Recreation Permit Holders.
 - Hunt Permit Holders. (Valid only through the end of hunting season).
 - From mid-October to mid-January (exact dates to be set by Natural Resources Office)
 - Hunt Permit Holders.
 - Outdoor Recreation Permit Holders may have limited access as specified by the Natural Resources Office and advertised on the pre-recorded message. (813-452-4223).
- 8:00 pm Monday to 12:00 noon Thursday, year-round.
 - Outdoor Recreation Permit Holders who work or reside on the installation.
 - Hunt Permit Holders who work or reside on the installation. (Valid only through the end of the hunting season. NO MIDWEEK HUNTING PERMITTED!)

Special Access

- Scout troops or other nonprofit organizations using areas not listed as free of charge will have the option of doing a conservation project or paying \$0.50 per person. This requires a Special Event Permit and must be requested 2 weeks in advance of the activity. Contact the Natural Resources Office (813-452-4119) for more information.
- The Lake Arbuckle Boardwalk is open to all Avon Park Air Force Range personnel (personnel working or residing on the installation, including those personnel authorized to use the FamCamp) free of charge.

OUTDOOR RECREATION PERMITS

- An Outdoor Recreation Permit is required by all individuals, 18 years or older, using the Public Recreation Area as allowed by the rules of access, except Hunt Permit Holders during the posted hunting season. Possession of an Outdoor Recreation Permit certifies that the individual named on the permit is 18 years or older, has signed a Release of Liability, has paid the recreation fee, and has been fully briefed and understands the regulations.
- An Outdoor Recreation Permit allows the holder to use all open Management Units for all forms of outdoor recreation except hunting or other activities excluded in this regulation. He/she may bring one underage (under 18 years of age) dependent to participate in outdoor recreation activities.
- With the payment of an additional fee, a Permit Holder may bring his/her family. A "family" is herein defined to be the Permit Holder's spouse and his dependents who will be under 18 years of age on the first day of July 1992. All family members must be accompanied by and under direct control of a family member who is an Outdoor Recreation Permit Holder who has paid a family supplemental fee (exception: the unpermitted family member does not have to be accompanied by the Permit holder when in a designated campground).
- Each Outdoor Recreation Permit Holder is allowed to bring 2 underage (younger than 18 years) non-family guests onto the installation each weekend. Underage Guest Permits must be purchased by the Outdoor Recreation Permit Holder. Each underage Guest Permit will be issued for a named guest and is valid for the entire weekend. These guest permits cost \$1.00 per individual. Outdoor Recreation Permit Holders are liable for the actions of their guests when on the installation. Underage Guests must be accompanied by Outdoor Recreation Permit Holders whenever they are on the installation and must be under the direct control of the Permit Holders.
- Use of the Lake Arbuckle Hiking Trail or the Florida Trail (within the installation) requires no permit but hikers must stop at the Natural Resources Office to obtain a permit and Vehicle Pass and execute a Release of Liability. Hikers must also fill out an Outdoor Recreation Report and check out before leaving the installation. "Through hikers" on the Florida Trail are not required to check in or out at the Natural Resources Office. Individuals interested in hiking portions of the Florida Trail outside the installation should refer to the Florida Trail Association Manual.

ACCESS PROCEDURES

- Because of the presence of hazardous materials, certain portions of the Public Recreation Area are PERMANENTLY CLOSED to public access. These areas are plainly identified on the ground and on the Public Recreation Area Map. The General Public may never enter these areas.
 - Upon LEAVING the installation for the weekend, each Permit Holder must:
 - Turn in all UNIT Passes, either at a CHECK STATION or the NATURAL RESOURCES OFFICE.
 - Fill out a WEEKLY OUTDOOR RECREATION REPORT for his/her group and turn it in, either at a CHECK STATION or the NATURAL RESOURCES OFFICE.
 - Check out through the Natural Resources Office or the Frostproof gate (if open).
- Because of temporary hazards created during some military activities, the entire Public Recreation Area or certain portions of it are TEMPORARILY CLOSED to public access from time to time. To insure safety, the Public Recreation Area is divided into Management Units which are opened or closed to access depending on the military activities at the moment. Access is allowed in open Management Units only. The General Public may never enter these areas when they are closed. As a safety measure the following procedures must be observed by every Permit Holder:
 - Upon entering the Public Recreation Area, proceed DIRECTLY to either the Natural Resources Office CHECK STATION, the Willingham Campground CHECK STATION, or the Morgan Hole Campground CHECK STATION. Permit Holders should stop at the Natural Resources Office if they are purchasing permits or need more information than is posted at the check stations.
 - At the CHECK STATION, perform the following actions:
 - CHECK THE CURRENT STATUS MAP. This map identifies those MANAGEMENT UNITS which are open at the moment.
 - CHECK THE FORECAST NOTICE. This gives the estimated opening and closing times of each MANAGEMENT UNIT and is intended only to help the Permit Holder plan his/her weekend. Since schedule changes occur, it is the Permit Holder's responsibility to check the MANAGEMENT UNIT status each day.
 - SELECT MANAGEMENT UNIT PASSES. Passes are available any time a Management Unit is open, but they are NOT available when a Management Unit is closed. Possession of more than 3 Unit Passes at any time is prohibited. Permit Holders may trade or exchange passes at any time. Possession of Management Unit Passes for any closed unit is prohibited. Family members and guests do not need to have Unit Passes because they must be escorted by the Permit Holder in the Management Units.

ACCESS PROCEDURES (Cont.)

- PICK UP A WEEKLY OUTDOOR RECREATION REPORT FORM. Each group of outdoor recreationists must complete and turn in one report each weekend.
 - Upon LEAVING the installation for the weekend, each Permit Holder must:
 - Turn in all UNIT Passes, either at a CHECK STATION or the NATURAL RESOURCES OFFICE.
 - Fill out a WEEKLY OUTDOOR RECREATION REPORT for his/her group and turn it in, either at a CHECK STATION or the NATURAL RESOURCES OFFICE.
 - Check out through the Natural Resources Office or the Frostproof gate (if open).

USE OF VEHICLES

- Vehicles must be operated on designated roads and trails. Designated roads and trails are defined as only those roads and trails found on the Public Recreation Area Map.
- Horses, 2- or 3-wheeled motor vehicles, and air boats are prohibited. Small "ATV" type vehicles, including "4-wheelers" are specifically prohibited.
- Any vehicle entering the installation must have a current license plate, meet federal and state safety requirements, and be operated by a licensed driver. Current vehicle registration and proof of insurance must be in the vehicle while on the installation. Only rubber-tired vehicles are permitted.
- Vehicles will not be parked in such a manner as to obstruct roads or firelanes.
- The use of vehicles is prohibited in the Public Recreation Area between 10:00 pm and 4:30 am except on Frostproof and Kissimmee Roads or during emergencies.
- During 19 September-18 October 1992 and 20 March-25 April 1993, vehicular traffic is prohibited between sunrise to 2 hours past sunrise in Management Units 12, 13, and the southern half (south of Kissimmee Road) of Unit 10. (Exceptions: Van Eeghan and Kissimmee Roads).

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- The possession of any type on weapon (including pellet or BB guns) by any individual outside the posted hunting season is prohibited. During the hunting season only Hunt Permit Holders may possess a weapon. Professional law enforcement officers are allowed to carry their authorized service pistols.
- The transportation of live game is prohibited.
- All animals are protected and may not be harassed, injured, killed, or removed from the installation, except as specifically authorized by the Natural Resources Manager and state and federal hunting and fishing regulations.
- Plants, animals, or historic or cultural artifacts shall not be taken or collected. Neither plants or their parts nor any animals shall be introduced, liberated, planted or placed on any part of the installation, except as specifically authorized by the Natural Resources Manager.
- The operation or placing of game feeders, baiting station, or bait is prohibited.
- Live trees or standing dead trees may not be cut.
- Driving metal objects into any tree or use of a tree into which a metal object has been driven is prohibited.
- Destroying, damaging, or vandalizing any sign, building, fence, or other man-made structure is prohibited.
- All closed gates must be kept closed.
- Littering is prohibited. The dumpsters at campgrounds shall not be utilized for any household garbage. The spilling, pumping, or other discharge of contaminants, or human waste on the installation is prohibited.
- All dogs brought into the Public Recreation Area must be penned or leashed (except for special provisions for dogs used by permitted hunters). All dogs must wear a collar bearing the name and address of the owner and have a current rabies vaccination tag. The training of hunting dogs is prohibited.

12. Campers bringing dogs onto the installation between 19 September 1992 and 03 January 1993 must camp in either Morgan Hole Campground or the Fort Kissimmee Campground. Dogs are prohibited on the installation during Spring Turkey Season (20 March-25 April 1993).

GENERAL REGULATIONS (Cont.)

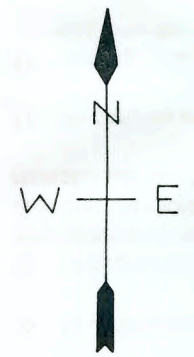
- Morgan Hole, Fort Kissimmee, and Willingham are the only designated campgrounds. Campground boundaries are marked by signs.
- No campfires may be left unattended.
- All generators must be turned off by 11:00pm.
- Campground quiet hours are 11:00 pm-4:30 am. Please be considerate of others by keeping noise to a minimum. People and/or dogs creating excessive noise or other behavior which disturbs other recreationists may be removed from the installation.
- No camping within 25 feet of a well, latrine, or shower facility.
- Hunting while intoxicated or possession of open alcoholic beverage containers in a moving vehicle is prohibited.
- The General Public must display their permits, hunting or fishing licenses, and/or identification and/or submit to a vehicle inspection upon request from any Outdoor Recreation program employee, Air Force Security Police Officer, or Wildlife Officer.
- All persons 16 years or older must carry some form of current photographic identification while on the installation.
- No ordnance or any other military material shall be tampered with, handled, or removed from the installation.
- Individuals travelling off designated roads or outside campground between 24 October 1992 and 07 March 1993 must wear a minimum of 500 square inches of solid daylight orange material as an outer garment. Such clothing must be worn above the waistline and must include a head covering.

SPECIAL FISHING REGULATIONS

- Tomlin Hammock Lake: One bass is the daily bag limit. The daily bag limit for all other fish is 10.
- All persons shall comply with state and federal license laws. All state fishing regulations will be enforced.


















Avon Park Air Force Range Public Recreation Area Map



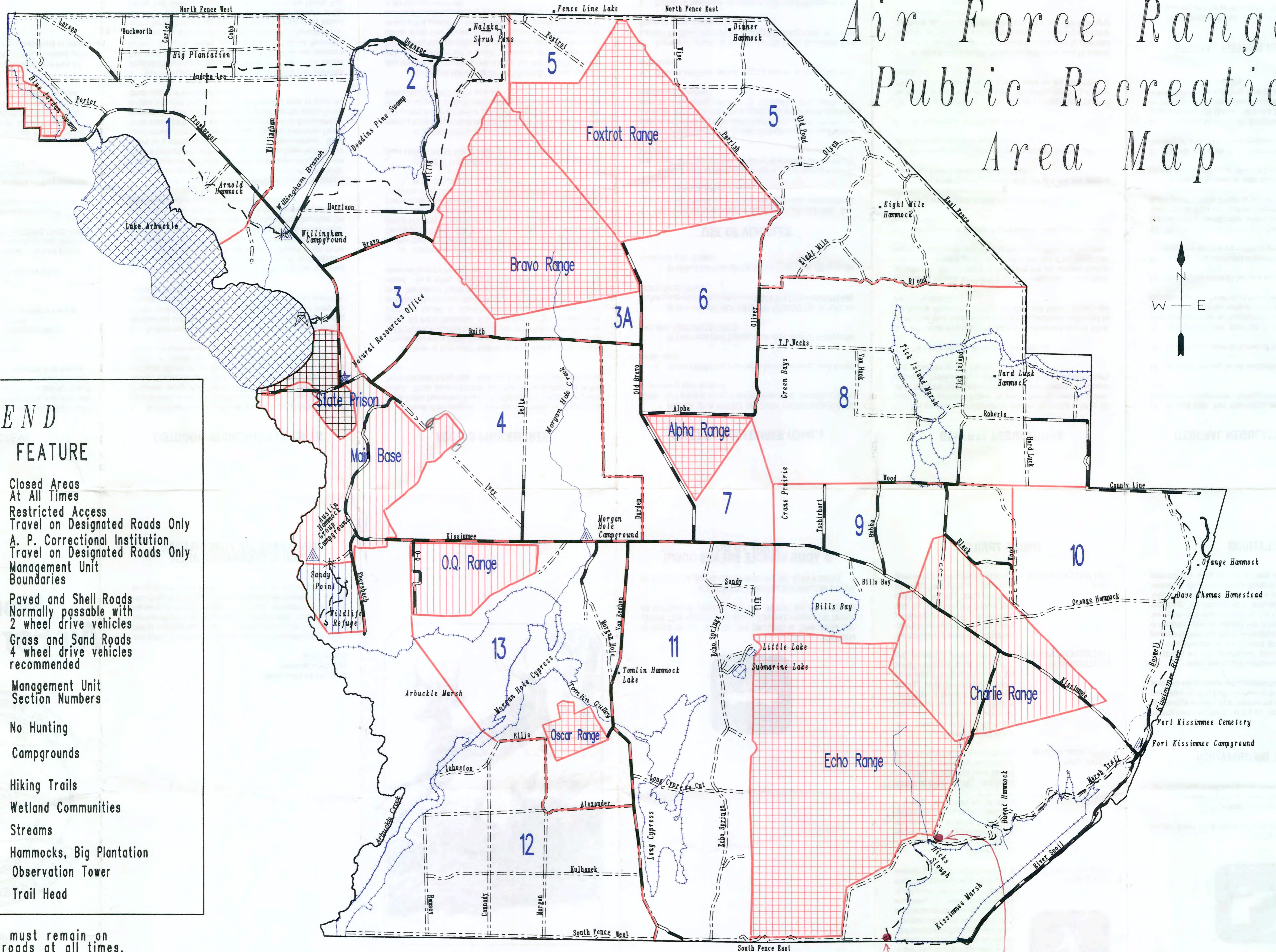

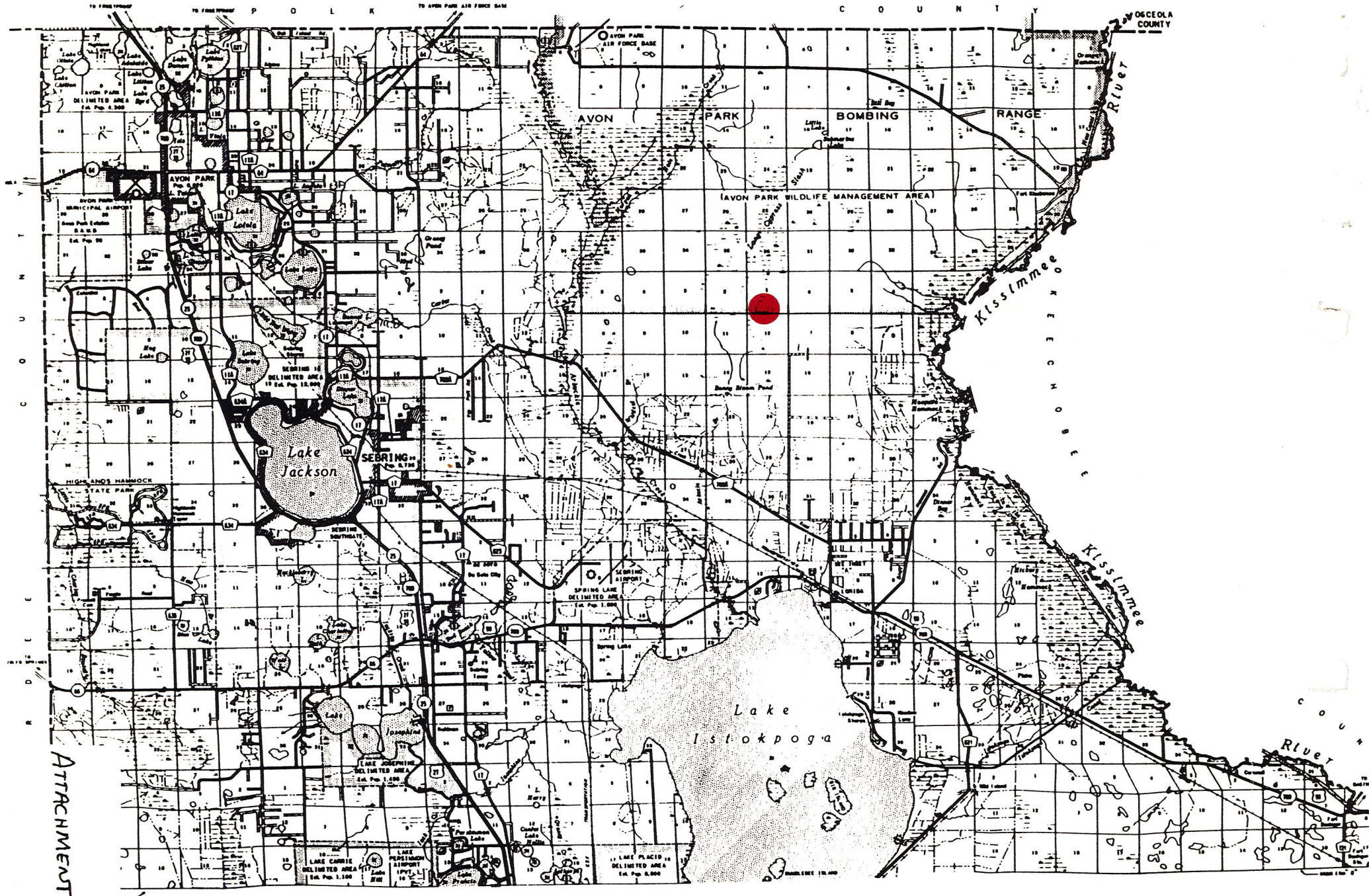

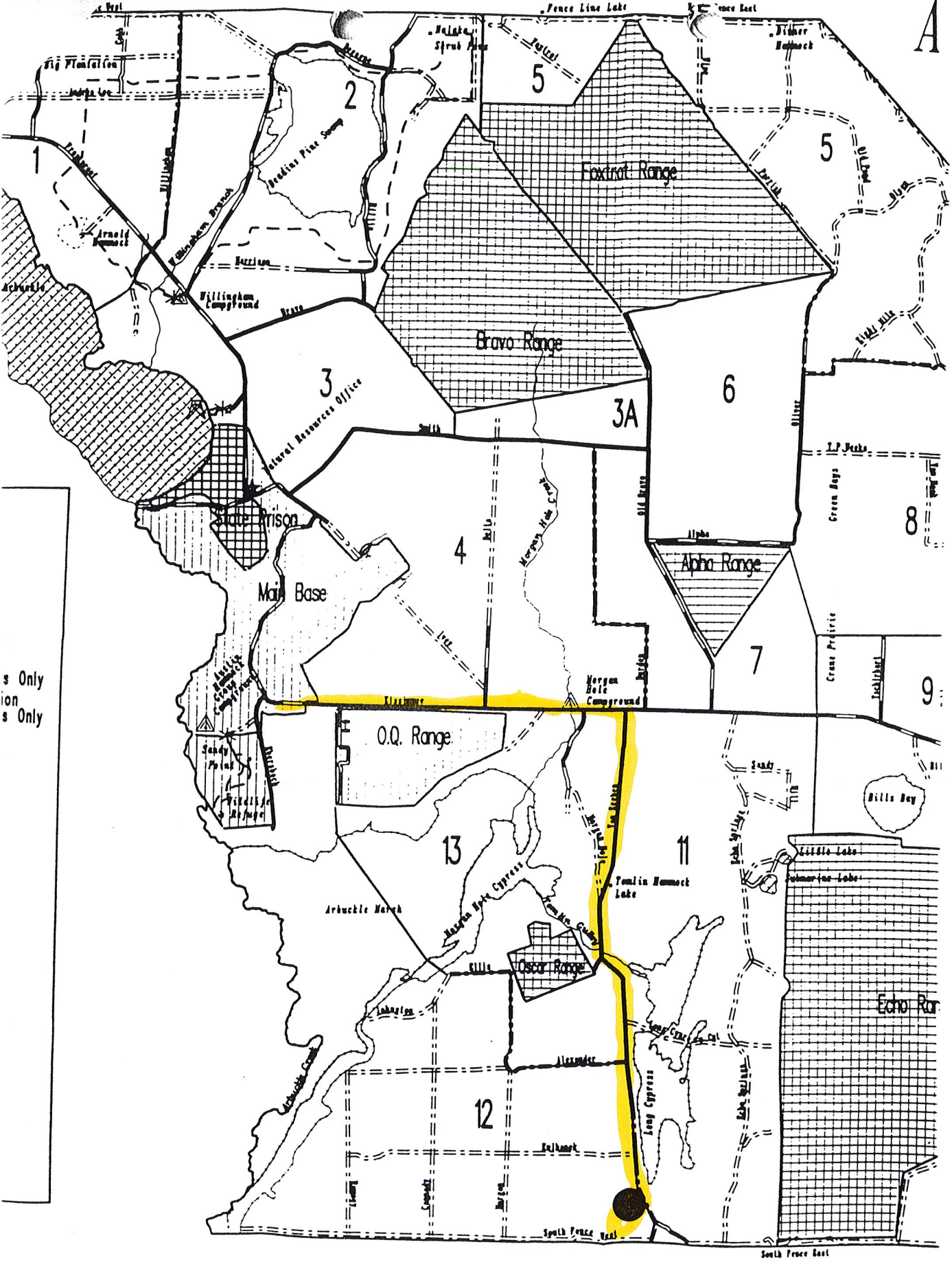


WELL LOCATIONS

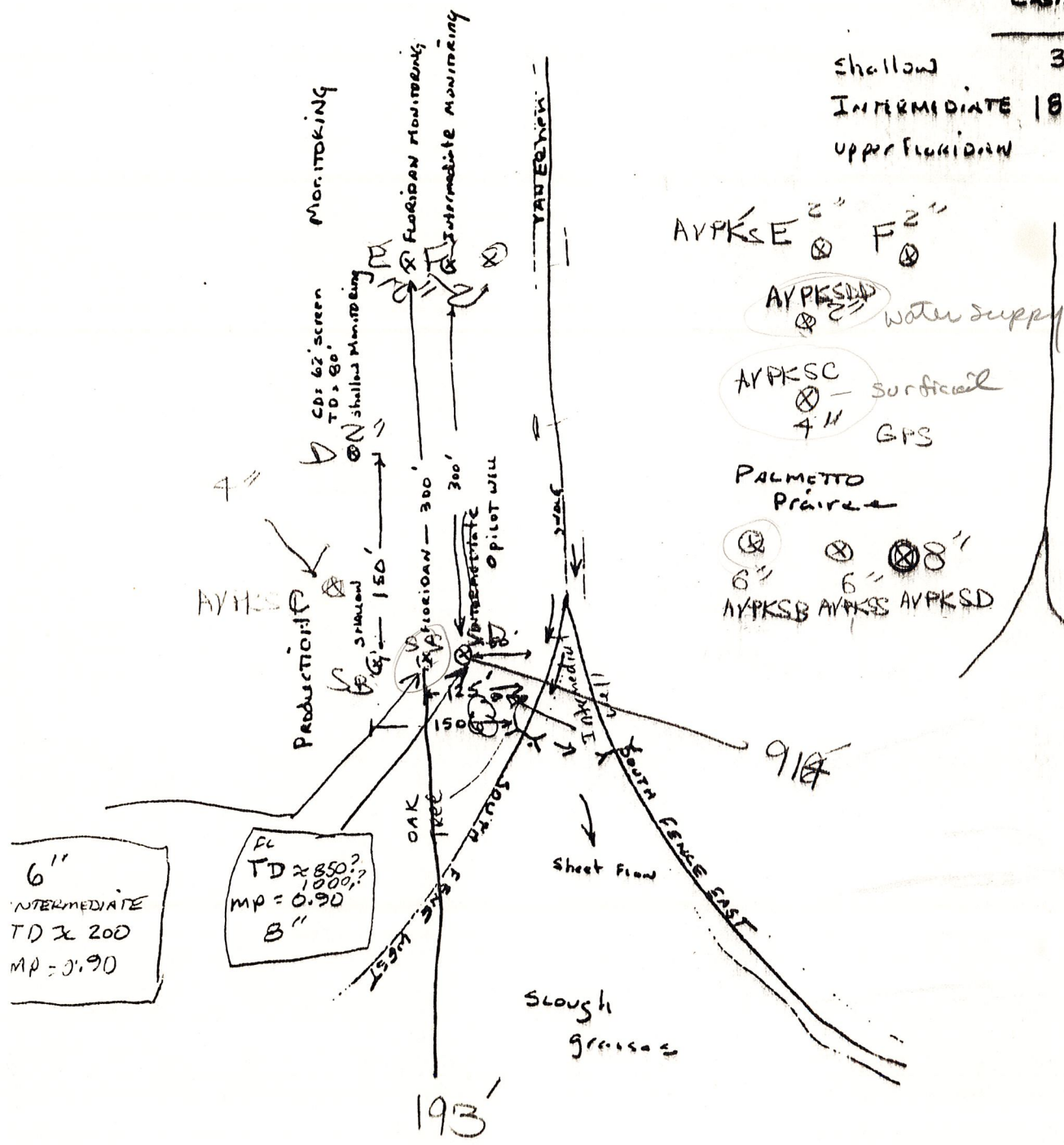

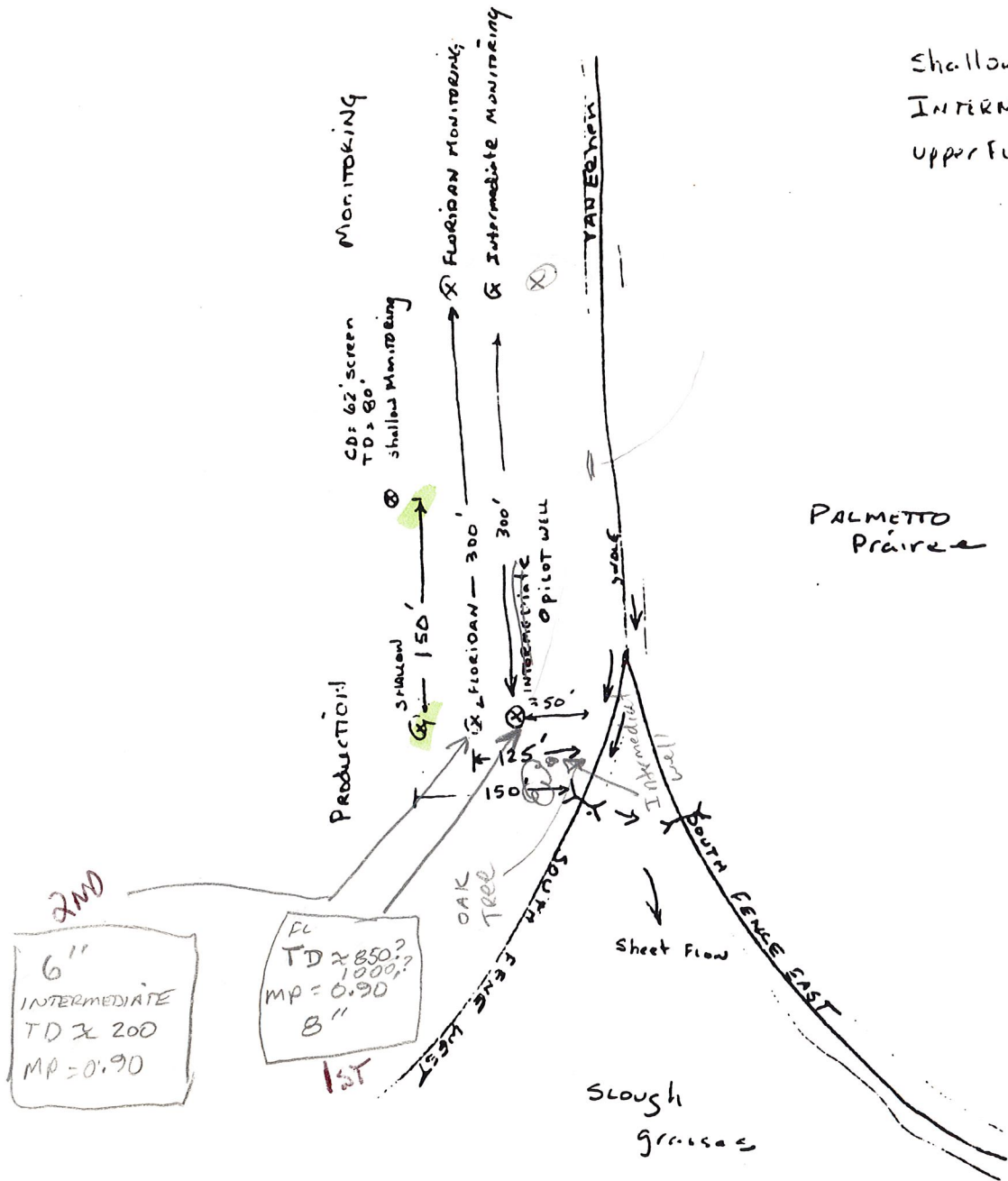

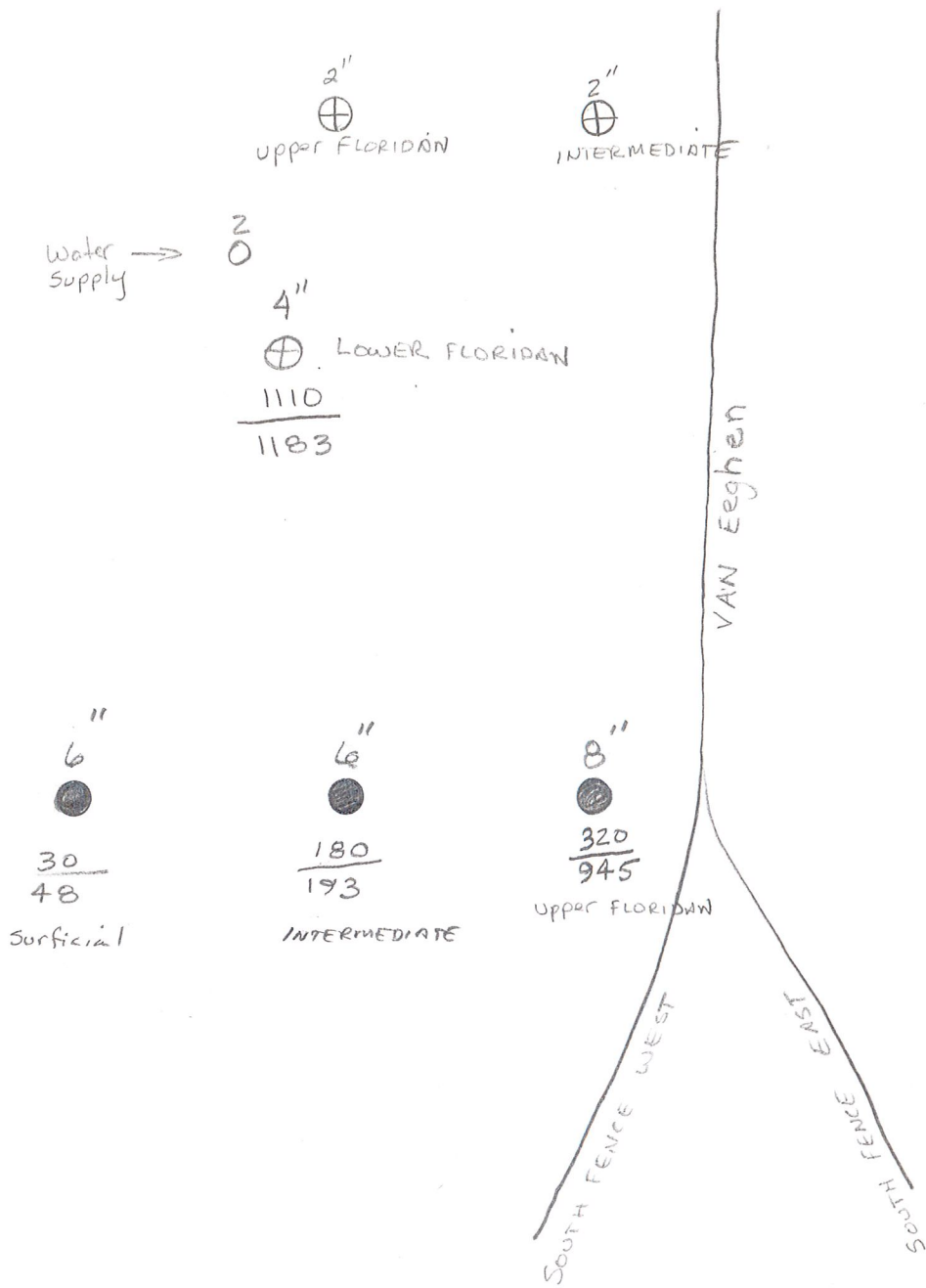
